

Project goal: Design four pages that are appropriate for the target audience you have chosen. Save these pages, you can use them in your portfolio when looking for a job.

Assignment basics:

- Using Photoshop and InDesign, design a magazine template that has the following: a cover, an index page and a cover story (a.k.a. center spread). Four pages total
- Choose and tone photos for the project
- Pick at least one story for center spread that relates to the photo on the cover. Find it via Google, you don't have to write it yourself
- Design an index page (you can make up the refers; they don't have to refer to actual stories.)
- There is no limit on what photos, or any other graphics, you can use as long as they are class appropriate
- Project is to be turned in on time and in our Google Drive (link on website)
- Save both the .indd file AND a .pdf version. When exporting the .pdf, make sure to select Spreads
- Two to three minute in-class presentation, which is organized and shows the page's highlights

Components:

- Cover has lead photo, a nameplate, refer headlines in color/box or both, and a refer to cover story inside (a.k.a. center spread)
- Center spread (double truck) is designed as one component or two separate pages
- Center spread contains, headlines (main and sub), stories, photos, cutlines & photo credit
- Index page balances needs of content and design, color is used to differentiate content
- At least three cutout photos used somewhere in your project, different pages are fine
- At least two shapes are created in InDesign that have color and text in them, any page is fine
- Headlines and cutlines are well written and free of spelling and grammar errors

Design:

- Pages are aesthetically pleasing; that is, they look good
- Page design is well planned; flow is established by arrangement of entry points
- Pages use template grids to line up elements
- Photos are cropped properly. Images and text are placed properly on page (no "stretched" looking photos or text)
