

Mansplaining to become official language of the United States

WASHINGTON - Mansplaining is set to become the new official language of the US, after Congress passed the legislation Friday. The bill defines mansplaining as "just talking to a woman like every guy already does."

"Women don't always comprehend the 'real world'," said Senator Steve Kasinsky, the bill's sponsor during Friday's press conference. "They need help understanding how to use a map or the right way to put a tampon in."

Pulitzer Prize winning reporter Sara Jones asked if Sen. Kasinsky's views seemed patronizing and myopic, Kasinsky responded, "My, those certainly are big words. Do you even know what patronizing means?"
